DISCUSSION WITH CONFIRMANDS

What is Faith?

PRAYER FOR THE CONFIRMANDS *(Spoken by the Pastor/Congregation)*

O Lord Jesus Christ, You laid Your hands in blessing upon children that came to You, saying that to them the Kingdom of Heaven belongs. We present before You in this prayer, the members of the 2019 Confirmation Class who will confirm their faith before Your altar. We ask You to continue to give them knowledge and understanding in all that will make their lives one of praise to You. Ever increase their devotion, so that they may know You, fear You, fervently love You, and faithfully serve You for the sake of Your precious name. Amen

RITE OF CONFIRMATION *(The confirmands stand; the congregation is seated)*

Pastor: Dear members of the confirmation class: At one time you were received into God's covenant of grace in Holy Baptism. By means of this sacrament you were freed from the power of darkness and called to be disciples of Jesus Christ, your Lord. Since that time you have been instructed in the Word of God and in the true meaning of the Holy Sacraments according to the Confessions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church. At this time I invite you to confirm the Christian faith which was confessed at your Baptism and be thereby reminded again of the covenant of grace which God made with you at that time.

Do you believe in God the Father?

Confirmands: Yes, I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Pastor: What does this mean?

All: I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses, and still takes care of them. He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life. He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil. All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him. This is most certainly true.

Pastor: Do you believe in Jesus Christ?

Confirmands: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. From thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Pastor: What does this mean?

All: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord, who has redeemed me a lost and condemned person, purchased and won me from all sins, from death, and from the power of the devil; not with gold or silver, but with His holy, precious blood and with His innocent suffering and death, that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness, just as He is risen from the dead, and lives and reigns to all eternity. This is most certainly true.

Pastor: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

Confirmands: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

Pastor: What does this mean?

All: I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the

same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

Pastor: The Ten Commandments as recorded in Exodus 20: 5-6 “And God spoke all these words: “I am the Lord your God; You shall have no other gods before me, You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God, Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it Holy, Honor your father and mother, You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. You shall not covet your neighbor’s house. You shall not covet your neighbor’s wife, or his manservant or maidservant, his ox or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor.” What does God say about all these commandments?

All: He says: “I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sins of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments.”

Pastor: What does this mean?

All: God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands.

Pastor: And now I ask you, the members of the confirmation class, in the presence of God and this congregation, do you intend to continue in this Christian faith which you have publicly confessed?

Confirmands: Yes, with the help of God.

Pastor: Do you intend, as members of Immanuel Evangelical Lutheran Church, to continue steadfast in the confession of this church as you have learned to know it in Luther's Small Catechism?

Confirmands: Yes, with the help of God.

Pastor: Do you intend with the help of God to conform your life to the rule of the divine Word: to be diligent in the use of the means of grace, to conduct yourselves worthy of the Gospel of Christ, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to the Triune God?

Confirmands: Yes, by the grace of God.

Pastor: Since it is God alone who enables us both to will and do His good pleasure, it is fitting for us to call on Him to complete the good work which He has begun in our confirmands through Holy Baptism and continued in them by instruction in His Holy Word.

We pray, Almighty and everlasting God, who makes us both willing and able to do those things which are good and acceptable to Your divine majesty, we humbly come to You for these Your servants. We implore You that You would let Your fatherly hand ever be over them; may Your Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of Your Word that in the end they may obtain everlasting life; through our Lord Jesus Christ, who, with You and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, lives and rules eternally.

People: Amen.

Pastor: Dear Confirmands, give then your hand as a pledge of your promise, and kneel to receive the blessing.

(The confirmands come forward with their family to kneel before the altar.)
