GRACE SPACE

At Immanuel Lutheran Church, as Jesus did, we welcome children of all ages as integral members of the body of Christ, and we welcome the sounds and activity that accompany them! There are a number of options and activities designed for children to experience and participate in worship according to their needs, we trust families to work out the best option(s) for them and their child(ren) on any given day.

We also understand that it takes a village to raise a child. A few tips for engaging our families with small children include:

- Greeting/learning the names of the young children who sit near you in worship.
- ♦ Offering to read or color with one child during worship, especially if another child in the family is especially fussy or upset.
- ♦ Helping preschoolers and elementary-aged kids to navigate the liturgy, locate the songs/hymns, etc. (Children learn to worship by participating!)
- ♦ Inviting kids to serve alongside you in worship, as greeters, ushers, etc.

Grace Space will be provided at all services, supervision as available. Otherwise, we ask you to supervise your children when they are using Grace Space.

Holy Communion is offered to those who have been instructed in what the Scriptures teach about Communion. We believe the Bible teaches:

- 1) Jesus Christ is our only Lord and Savior from all sin, death, and the power of evil;

- 3) We resolve to dedicate our lives to the service of our Lord in His Body, the Church, through worship, sacrificial giving, and thankful living.
